- Approved request from Bluffton Lions Club to have a registration and communication station under a small awning in the church lawn facing Main Street during the afternoon and evening of Friday, June 16 for the Festival of Wheels.
- Looking for replacement for Laura Irwin (Youth Group and Children's Church) who is graduating this year. Brooklyn Phillips (Children's Church) will return in September she will be a junior at Bluffton University. English Lutheran Church is hosting community Vacation Bible School July 16-20. We are responsible for refreshments recruiting volunteers. Looking for someone to lead Young Youth Formation Class and Adult Faith Formation a monthly rotation is a possibility. The Young Youth Faith Formation class and Children's Church started summer break at the end of May.
- Annual church review/audit for 2022 was completed by Ohio Northern University accounting students (Auditing class). Elder Victim Ministry

Since the beginning of the year, Elder Victim Ministry has worked with 70 victims of violence (elder abuse, assault, domestic violence, violation of a protection order, menacing, threats). Surveys reflect that in one year's time, one in 10 older adults become victims of elder abuse. Experts estimate that elder abuse is significantly underreported. So, who is at risk? Women, people who are divorced or separated, people of color and those in poor health. Also, people living with a low income are more likely to be physically or psychologically abused. Elders with a higher income are more likely to be financially exploited.

How can we be protected from elder abuse? Social support! Crime Victim Services believes communities thrive when all members prevail over trauma and support one another. Be more intentional with your acquaintances and relationships. Commit to participating in more ongoing social networks. Connecting regularly helps us all not only show care for our older neighbors but also to monitor their wellbeing.

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day, June 15

On Thursday, June 15, we're asked to 'Build Strong Support for Elders' on World Elder Abuse Awareness Day. Experts estimate that elder abuse is significantly underreported by victims and community members alike. Is elder abuse an "invisible problem?" Ageism in our society factors in here.

Already feeling marginalized and undervalued due to ageism, elders sometimes become reluctant to report abuse. Hesitancy to share abuse incidents can also be due to embarrassment, shame, or fear of retaliation. If the abuser is a family member, the elder often doesn't want them getting in trouble.

What is elder abuse? It's mistreatment of a person aged 60 and older including: isolation, intentional harm, neglect, self-neglect, intimidation, sexual violence, threats, under or over medicating, ridicule, financial exploitation, and fraud. One sign it's elder abuse: fear of a family member or care provider.

Who can report elder abuse? Anyone at any age can report their concerns to Adult Protective Services through their Sheriff's Office. This can be anonymous. Who is obligated by law to report elder abuse? Here's a partial list: financial institution, legal, medical, and mental health practitioners and their employees, EMTs, fire fighters, social workers, psychologists, clergy, humane society workers, publicly owned building employees, real estate agents, notaries, and senior services workers.
