Spring Fling

Marilyn Edwards and Linda Nelson are planning on having a "Ten Thousand Village Trunk Sale" at our church on Sunday, March 19 (this will be in the back of the sanctuary right after the service). We will be helping Ten Thousand Villages support third world countries by buying the wares made by the artisans of these countries. We will be promoting Spring home additions both inside and outside, gift giving made easy, for youth, college students, and adults, and Easter add-ons. Some of the items we will be offering are bird houses, planters, baskets, jewelry, soap, food, and candy.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA)

The scale of the disaster facing Syria and Turkey after the February 6 earthquake is becoming clearer. The 7.8-magnitude quake and its aftershocks have left thousands of people dead and thousands more injured; these numbers will rise as search and rescue continues.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery in the impacted area. PDA will remain active throughout the entire recovery process, accompanying our partners in the area as they determine long-term program needs and providing financial support for building and resilience.
