SESSION

February Meeting Highlights

- Deacons and Elders were ordained/installed on January 26 during the Annual Congregational Meeting. All year-end forms for Maumee Valley Presbytery and General Assembly were submitted electronically. Session Minutes Book and Church Membership Rolls Book will be reviewed by MVP in early March. Approved to not object to Greenhorn's request to transfer Liquor Permit to new owners that will operate at same location.
- Hazel Rodabaugh passed away on February 3, 2025. Services will be February 28 at the Ada Funeral Home. Deacons and Cole May are reaching out to family.
- Approved request from Bluffton Area
 Ministerial Association to use front church lawn
 for "Ashes to Go" on Ash Wednesday in the
 morning.
- Few faulty carbon monoxide testers were replaced at the church. Removed snow/ice at the church. Replaced the refrigerator at the manse and hooked up the water/ice maker. Manse cleaned one last time (thanks, Kerry!) before the May's move in. Upon Orkin's inspection of the attic in the manse, we became aware that mice had taken up residence in the attic. Their recommendation to remediate this problem includes removing all insulation in the attic, sanitizing the area, installing new insulation, and closing possible entry points. Crawl space under the kitchen will also need to be evaluated. Orkin's estimate to remedy this was \$10,000. A second estimate is being secured. Approved spending up to \$10,000 to remedy the mice problem at the manse. Cole May will be informed that because of health concerns they are not able to move in/drop things off until this has been corrected.

- Initial Confirmation Class (led by Tenna Rhonemus) was held on Sunday, February 3 with 7 attendees and the class went well.
- Ohio Northern University students in the Advanced Auditing course are conducting a review of the 2024 financial controls and records, similar to past years. Annual review is required by PC(USA). Treasurer has met with the students a couple times and provided information. Students will issue a final report in late April.

We then receive a 1% rebate. Even small receipts are worth turning in; the combined total adds up. Please do not cut off the bottoms of your receipts because only whole receipts qualify. Last year, BPC received rebates totaling \$452, and Darlene just turned in a batch that will result in a \$310 rebate.
