## Pastor's Letter: Fruit of the Spirit?

What's your favorite fruit? If you're like me, you have many favorites (a much longer list than favorite vegetables!). The "best" fruit in my opinion is probably not one kind, but rather any that is freshly picked and perfectly ripe: ready to be eaten and fuel the body with nutrients!

Just like we need to eat a well-balanced and nutritious diet for our physical health, we need to give similar care and attention to our spiritual health. That's why we're taking time this summer to do a deep dive into the fruit of the spirit. Like good nutrition, spiritual health comes from the inside out and is a consistent and life-long commitment. Being a fruitful Christian does not come from clocking in and out on Sunday mornings, but from daily living that strives to please God and serve others – daily living in which the fruit of the spirit is made manifest in our lives.

The fruit of the Spirit is a well-known passage found in Galatians 5:22-23. All the items in this list – love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control – are not (multiple) fruits of the spirit, but the (one) fruit of the spirit. While we can certainly describe them in different terms, in the end, the emphasis is on their unity as the positive results that show up in our lives when God is working in us. This is in opposition to what happens in our lives when we follow what Paul calls the flesh - which is not a literal reference to our bodies, but a way to describe our sinful nature, where we act in ways that are selfish, greedy, and divisive. By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is the result of our willingness to listen to the Spirit's guidance. It can serve as proof – to others, and to ourselves – that we are walking in God's ways.

So, whatever you eat this summer, I urge you to consider how you are also bearing the fruit of the Spirit – demonstrating your faith through the ways you care for friends and strangers alike. When you do, you will surely experience a most satisfying and delightful day of faithfulness!


#### FAITH FORMATION Children's Church & Nursery


# Summer of Song: A Concert Series by the Presbyterian Giving Catalog
