

Pastor's Letter

What is the first Sunday of the month?

December 1! When does the season of Advent begin? December 1! When does the new liturgical year start? December 1! Everything aligns this year such that December 1 is the clear beginning of our season of Advent, when we prepare for the coming of Christ into our midst.

Our theme for Advent will be Waiting Well. According to PC(USA) Minister and Former General Assembly Moderator Bruce Reyes-Chow, "Waiting is generally something that the world does not like to do. Waiting is inconvenient and, depending on the source of the waiting, can be seen as some kind of affront to our personhood or perceived as the result of incompetence or malice. Sure, there are times when the frustration of waiting is justified and worthy of challenge. But learning to wait well, no matter the reason or the season, is a spiritual discipline that contributes to emotional health, spiritual vitality, and actions that are grounded in faith." Throughout Advent, we will be encouraged to "look at ways in which we can wait well, challenging the negative assumptions that waiting means inaction, apathy, or a lack of passion, and moving toward waiting that is deliberate, disciplined, and just."

Join with us in weekly worship, as we light the candles in the Advent wreath and hear God's Word to us from the Gospel of Matthew. I also encourage you to take on a spiritual practice for the season of Advent. "Straw for the Manger," an Advent Devotional centered on the Matthew 25 scripture and denominational invitation, provides specific daily suggestions for how to do just that. Copies will be available in the sanctuary for you to take home and use on your own or with your family.

After 4 Sundays of learning to wait well, on Christmas Eve the choir will invite us to hear the Christmas story anew through their cantata, *I Hear the Prophet Callin'*. Join us in eager anticipation of the coming of Jesus into our world: Emmanuel – God with us.

Matthew 25: A PC(USA) Invitation

Matthew 25:31–46 calls all of us to actively engage in the world around us, so our faith comes alive and we wake up to new possibilities. Convicted by this passage, both the 2016 and 2018 General Assemblies exhorted the PC(USA) to act boldly and compassionately to serve people who are hungry, oppressed, imprisoned or poor. By accepting the Matthew 25 invitation, we can help our denomination become a more relevant presence in the world. We recognize Christ's urgent call to be a church of action, where God's love, justice and mercy shine forth and are contagious. And we rejoice how our re-energized faith can unite all Presbyterians for a common and holy purpose: our common identity to do mission.

To some degree, many churches are already doing the work of Matthew 25. We hope that by partnering with mid councils and congregations, we can together multiply and intensify our loving commitment to radical and fearless discipleship. When signing up, we will be asked to embrace one or more of the three areas of focus — building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism, and eradicating systemic poverty. Then as we live out our commitment, we will be asked to share the story of impact that our pledge has made: how our congregation has changed, how we've discovered new passions and vitality, how our members have been re-energized as disciples ... so like in the early church, your renewed faith will fan the flames and encourage other congregations to also embrace our common mission. 

 Approved hiring Roger Broadman as Custodian at \$50 per week beginning November 2. Approved purchasing a new vacuum cleaner for the church. Membership rolls were reviewed by Clerk/Pastor no recommended changes at this time.

- renewed for 2020. Outstanding response for "Roll On" balance at end of October \$1,260. Approved purchasing 2 new lapel wireless microphones which comply with new FCC regulations (\$973) from House of Hindenach with Jean Triplett Memorial money. Stewardship will once again work with the Ohio Northern University Auditing Class who will conduct the review of 2019 financial information.
- October Pastoral Care: 2 conversations with members/visitors; 6 home/hospital/nursing home visits and 14 cards sent. Congregational activities: Word in the World, Claralice Circle, Faith Formation Intern Supervision, committee meetings, Youth Group twice, hosted Halloween Party at manse, Member Rolls Review; Church Safety and Security Meeting, and Presbyterians 101. Presbytery events: MVP Restructure Retreat, Commissioned Ruling Elder Committee, New Pastors' Group, MVP Youth Retreat Planning, MVP Youth Retreat, and Discipleship Team Meeting. Schilling - First Christian Church of Findlay, and Louisville Seminary Alum Board Meeting/Alum Reunion/Festival of Theology. Approved Vacation Request (for 2020): February 3 -9 (including Sunday, February 9).
- Approved accepting gift of SMART TV from Bob and Tammie Hursh. SMART TV has been placed in the church basement and can be used for Youth Group, committee meetings, etc. Instructions will be placed by TV once it is operational.

Roll On Campaign Introduced to Help Tyler and Laura From

(Highlights from the Minute for Mission)

Many of you know the Hursey family—Tom and Rebecca, their daughters Lisa and Laura, and Tom's mother Dorothy. Each member of the family has served our congregation in some way. In 2007, Laura became engaged to Tyler From. Tyler was attending UNOH in Lima when he was introduced to Laura through a mutual friend. They were married in our sanctuary in 2008 and shortly afterwards moved to Wyoming. Less than a year later, a freak accident left Tyler paralyzed.

For the last 10 years, Laura has cared full-time for Tyler. Her parents built an accessible room onto their home so Tyler and Laura could live with them. During the last year, it has become evident that the conversion van that they have been using was at the end of its useful life. Many in our church family worried each time the Froms left for medical appointments in Michigan or for a vacation. A few months ago, Tyler and Laura qualified for a loan to purchase a 2016 For Transit handicap van. For the first time, Tyler can look forward as they travel - but best of all, our church family no longer has to worry when they travel!

The *Roll On* Campaign invites each member to consider a one-time or repeating gift to help underwrite the monthly van payment. The church has committed to paying \$220 (1/2 of the payment) each month. Each gift will make it easier for Tyler and Laura to afford this necessary vehicle. The Campaign includes options of \$55 (1/4 payment), \$110 (1/2 payment), \$165 (3/4 payment), \$220 (full payment) or any amount that fits your budget.

Thank you for considering this campaign. As of October 1, four months of payments have already been pledged! In addition, the Mission Committee is planning a Blaze of Lights Benefit Dinner on November 30 with proceeds going to the Roll On Campaign.
