Pastor's Letter:

Pastor's Annual Report 2021

If there were one word to describe this past year, it would be "adaptation." The lingering pandemic has required us to make not just one, but multiple pivots in how we approach the various aspects of our shared ministries. When it comes to the pandemic, we are learning to expect the unexpected. Perhaps that's the very way we should think about God's involvement in the world – the God who created a wild variety of creatures to roam this earth, who called leaders for Israel as diverse as Moses, David, and Esther, who came among us as a baby named Jesus who would save others through sacrificial love. To paraphrase Augustine: if we think we have understood God, what we have understood is not God! And yet, the Spirit calls us to continue our journey through unknown mountains and valleys – walking by faith, not by sight.

In our mutual journey, we had many comings and goings in 2021. We experienced the departure of several persons for various reasons; we especially feel the loss of Lin Rumer, even as we celebrate her resurrection to new life in Christ. We said goodbye to 3 staff members who concluded their time with us: Children's Church Teachers Kori Phipps and Shawna Anderson, and Custodian Roger Brodman. We are grateful for officers who have completed their terms of service: Lynda Best, Tanya Best, Craig Bowman, and Libby McVetta. On an encouraging note, we were blessed to receive 3 new active members, many visitors in person and online, and a qualified candidate to fill our new staff position, Communications Coordinator Abigail Gwin.

Many particulars characterize our ministry in 2021:

- Began the year with worship via livestream only, resuming an in-person option in March, with masks required most months, mirroring local rates of COVID-19.
- Partnered with BAMA to provide gifts of encouragement to local frontline workers.
- Held four monthly outdoor worship services from the beautiful new gazebo.
- Coordinated donations to stock our Little Free Pantry for local individuals and families.
- Began using our new electronic sign to display church and community news to passersby.

- Engaged the breadth of scripture through several unique sermon series: Again & Again (Lent – Easter), The Lord's Prayer, The Fruit of the Spirit, Feasting with God (the sacrament of Communion), Legacy (Stewardship), and Living In-Between (Advent).
- Dove deeper into topics of interest through short-term study groups: "Exploring Bible Basics" and "Who Are the Presbyterians?".
- Held special services: Blessing of the Animals, Reformation Day Lessons & Carols, two youth-led services, and Candlelight Christmas Eve (gratefully, with an in-person option).
- Celebrated a baby shower in anticipation of the double miracle of new life due in 2022!
- Continued to tweak our livestream capabilities to better serve our remote worshippers.

Beyond the numbers, the lists, and the reports, we recognize that we have persevered, stayed the course through faith, and continued to look beyond ourselves, wrestling with how to live more fully into our commitment to being a PC(USA) Matthew 25 Congregation. Let us enter a new year inspired by Hebrews 12:1-2: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, ...let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus...."

Temporary Clergy Coverage

Session has approved a Temporary Clergy Coverage Services Agreement with Rev. Chris Schilling – Pastor Karol's husband, an ordained Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) minister! Excluding the first two weeks after delivery (so that he can enjoy an unofficial paternity leave), Chris will be working approximately 12 hours a week for the remainder of Pastor Karol's maternity leave.

In this arrangement, Chris will be responsible for:

- Worship Leadership (preparing and delivering sermons and coordinating service liturgy with other worship participants) and
- Emergency Pastoral Care (hospital/hospice visits/calls and funerals).

Thus, while you will see him regularly in the pulpit, his time during the week will be limited. (See more details in the January newsletter).

HIGHLIGHTS OF JANUARY SESSION MEETING



• **Pastor:** Continuing Education – Finding Light in The Dark Places: Training on Depression (½ day - Cornerstone of Hope, Lima). Anticipate New Parent Leave beginning on or before February 7

Pastoral Care: December: 13 visits/in-person conversations, 20 phone calls, 21 greeting cards sent (not counting baby shower thank you notes!), numerous texts and emails. Home Communion January 2: 1 served with Deacon Tenna Rhonemus.

Congregational Activities: Worship (planning, coordinating, leading), announcements information to Communication Coordinator, Sunday Faith Formation, Claralice Circle, moderate Congregational Meeting, Faith Formation Intern semester review with Faith Formation Chair, Ordination/Installation of 2022 Officers, Children's Church Leaders exit interview with Faith Formation Chair, Women's Ensemble Rehearsal, Christmas Eve Service, met with camera tech to review new Facebook login for livestream, and committee meetings.

Community Engagement Activities: BAMA Meeting.

Presbytery/Greater Church Activities: MVP Lectionary Study Zoom, MVP Discipleship Commission Zoom, MVP New Pastors Group Zoom.

Deacons Reorganized: Moderator – Chris Hochstetler, Vice-Moderator/Finances – Jana McVetta, Funeral Dinners – Cindy Gillen, Prayer Chain – Mike Rhonemus, Nominating Committee – Rob McGarrity, Community Meals – Tenna Rhonemus and Chris Hochstetler. Making plans for the Community Meal on Thursday, January 20. Because of high Covid-19 counts, Deacons have decided to make this a drive-thru meal versus in person.

- Session previously approved contract with SW Concrete and Construction for snow removal. Basically, anything over an inch will be removed from the walkways and steps around the church and anything over 3 inches at the Manse. Salt substitute used as needed. Elders agreed that if an inch of snow on Sundays/church meetings then first arrivals will sweep snow off sidewalk and salt as needed. Open bag of salt kept in church office. Five new cordless roller shades were approved, purchased, and installed at the manse. Mice at the manse (hearing in multiple walls): Orkin came December 20 to seal (found 3 possible places of entry on exterior of house) and set multi-traps in attic and furnace room. They returned January 4 no mice caught yet - single traps added in attic; sprayed for pests along interior of house. Arrangements made for First Klass Lawn Care to fertilize both church and manse at same rate as last year. Manse kitchen faucet "howls" every time it is turned on over about 40%. Clock in the church office needs a new battery. Fire extinguishers at church - company came week of January 3 for annual inspection to check/replace 5 units as needed. January - committee to check smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors. Furnace filters at church will be replaced. Church door handle has been repaired by Kevin Sommers - noted that better than when broken, but not as good as originally.
- Approved Personnel Committee for 2022 consist of Lori Schmidt, Phill Talavinia, and Sue Van Eman.
- Approved Worship Committee's request to purchase 12 sturdy wreath storage containers for approximately \$232.98, using funds from the Lin Rumer Memorial Fund. With proper care, our indoor Christmas wreaths, the Christmas wreaths Lin created, and others she made, can be used for years to come. Desktop computer and monitor were ordered from House of Hindenach and installed December 17. New computer will be used solely for livestreaming. Still experiencing occasional cutting out during special music, though a brand-new mic and cord were in place January 9. Sound techs are troubleshooting. Suggested that wireless mics might be needed if problems still exist. Approved Worship Committee's request to purchase a third wireless lapel mic using Memorial money.

- Electronically approved to install and test a dedicated desktop from Justin Byers to resolve livestreaming/video issues at a cost of \$970 from the Triplett fund. Elders/Deacons were ordained/installed on December 19. Approved General Assembly Statistical report (membership/finances).
- elected Lori Schmidt as Clerk, elected Julia Szabo as Treasurer, elected Lori Schmidt as Presbytery Commissioner, elected Sarah Brauen and Tom Edwards as co-chairs for Nominating Committee, agreed to continue meeting on second Thursday at 7:00 p.m. (no meeting in July), Composition of 2022 Session includes five males and four females which is not representative of our congregation in terms of gender. Confirmed that our Child & Youth Protection Policy & Procedures and Sexual Misconduct Policy are included in Manual of Operations. Approved for home communion to be served by Pastor and Deacon/Elder or two Deacons/Elders.
- Session spent time reviewing our current Covid-19 protocols. Agreed with counts higher now than before in Allen and Hancock counties, we need to continue masking, social distancing, and may need to consider going to live-stream only if numbers increase. Plan to revisit our Covid-19 protocols quarterly.

Worship Committee Report

With the church's new livestreaming software and equipment in place, video was greatly enhanced, but audio difficulties continued. Justin Byers (House of Hindenach Audio Visual Systems) strongly recommended that the church purchase a dedicated desktop computer to run the software and resolve our issues. In December 2021, Session approved this purchase, with funds coming from a memorial fund. The new computer, with monitor, has been installed. Technical adjustments are on-going.

Plans are in place for pulpit coverage while Pastor Karol is on New Parent Leave. Dates dependent upon babies' arrival. First two Sundays after delivery: Tenna Rhonemus and Adam Shanaman, third Sunday after delivery: Chris Schilling will start his time as preacher/worship leader during Pastor Karol's absence.

If Pastor Karol must begin her leave early for medical reasons: Chris Schilling (unless a hospitalization is required, then Diane Winebar or another.)

As night fell on December 10, a horrific line of tornadoes ripped across several states, ending the lives of more than 100 people and wreaking devastation across many communities by the time morning had broken. One of these tornadoes was on the ground for a terrifying and unprecedented 250 miles, more than 200 of those miles in Kentucky alone, where the town of Mayfield saw the catastrophic destruction of much of the downtown area, including the Presbyterian, Methodist, and Baptist churches. Stewardship Moment: Special Giving Opportunities

It's the time of year when our attention tends toward income taxes and how we can legitimately minimize our tax liabilities. The government has provided those of us who are in our senior years just such an opportunity. We know that the government requires that we take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) each year from our IRA retirement accounts. We saved to fund our retirement with pre-tax contributions, thus we have a tax liability when we withdraw those funds. It is currently possible to make a Qualified Charitable Deduction of our annual RMD by directing the account holder to make the annual distribution directly to the church or another charitable organization thus avoiding any tax liability for the distribution even if you do not itemize deductions when you file. If you need more information about taking advantage of this benefit, check with your tax advisor or with our church treasurer, Julia Szabo.

Our faith calls us to be responsible stewards of all of creation. I believe that includes the responsibility to make well thought-out plans for the distribution of that which we've accumulated over our lifetimes. Tax time is an ideal time to review your estate plans. Everyone should have a will directing your survivors how you want your earthly goods and assets to be distributed. Without a will, the impersonal laws of the State of Ohio will determine that distribution.

Your Stewardship and Finance Committee encourages our members to remember the church and direct some portion of your estate to the church. Such an estate gift will help assure that the ministries of the church can continue for our survivors and future generations (You can be sure that the State's plan will make no such provision!). Your plan can be a real, tangible gift to your family as they deal with the complications of settling your estate. And it can be a powerful message to your survivors about the priority the church has played in your life.

For many years, Bluffton Presbyterian Church has held a wintertime campaign, called Grace & Gratitude, to support the self-development of people. Gifts that address some of the most important issues people face at home and around the world, such as clean water, aid for refugees, widespread hunger, and women's empowerment, are supported through the Presbyterian Giving Catalog.

While the Mission Committee has chosen to focus on water projects for the past two years, this year, the campaign challenges us to purchase livestock – a living and renewable resource. The goal of \$500 will include:

- **5 Families of Chickens** (\$25/each) Eggs for food, feathers for pillows, and fertilizer for crops. By giving a family of chickens, you can help improve the food security and livelihoods of farmers and families around the world.
- **2 Piglets** (\$40/each) Piglets can serve as a valuable safety net a source of income for a family in need. When sold at market, a pig can be the very thing that helps a family through times of struggle.
- **2 shares of a Cow** (\$50/share) A dairy cow can provide a family in need with a reliable source of income and nourishment. Your gift also supports training in caretaking and sustainable breeding of livestock, improving food and income security for families and villages for years to come.
- 1 pair of Goats (\$178) Goats enhance food security through milk, cheese, butter, and yogurt. These valuable foods offer nutrition to those who need it most. The gift of a pair of goats is one that will keep providing.



What is per capita?

Like all Presbyterian (USA) churches, BPC pays an annual per capita bill based on the number of active members. Here's a breakdown of the 2022 per capita charge:

Maumee Valley Presbytery \$25.00 per member

Synod of the Covenant \$3.25 General Assembly \$8.98

Total \$37.23 per member

Per Capita Benefits
