Highlights of June Session Meeting



- **Month of May Pastoral Care:** 9 visits/in-person conversations, 19 phone calls, and 16 greeting cards sent. Visit restrictions loosened at Good Samaritan.
Congregational Activities: Worship, Facebook Posts, Lord's Prayer Discussion Group, Claralice Circle, Session Retreat, officiated at wedding of Laura From and Greg Elwood (gazebo), connecting with regular attendees/visitors, and committee meetings.
Community Engagement Activity: Bluffton Community Preschool Board Meeting.
Presbytery/Greater Church Activities: MVP Stated Meeting, MVP Preaching Workshop Panel Participant, MVP Leaders Space for Grace Zoom, Discipleship Commission meeting, met with new Co-Leader of 2021 MVP Rekindle Youth Retreat, Synod Racial Justice Preaching Workshop, and Commission/Worship Participant for Mary Beth McCandless' Installation Service.
- Water heater replaced at manse. Area reseeded at manse.
- Men's fellowship group meeting on Saturday mornings at 9:00 AM in Tom Edwards' garage. Women's fellowship group meets in Gazebo on Mondays at 6:30 PM.

- Rob McGarrity has agreed to fill unexpired Deacon term.
- Accepted gift of 12 chairs from Lori Schmidt. Approved to allow FJBoerog band to play in the Gazebo on Friday, June 18 during the Festival of Wheels. Approved to allow Gazebo to be used Sunday evening, May 23 for marriage of Laura From and Greg Elwood with Pastor Karol officiating. Approved request from Lynda Best to use Gazebo/church basement (at no cost) on Friday, August 13 from 6:00-10:00 PM for a mini Relay for Life – with entertainment, music, readings, and luminaries lit with glow sticks. Basement might be used to assemble the meal but would either be “to go” or eaten outside.
- Maumee Valley Presbytery met May 18 via Zoom. As of December 2020, MVP had 5,128 members (decrease of 341 from prior year). Rev. Mary Beth McCandless, served as Temporary Pastor at West Bethesda and West Eagle Creek churches for three years, officially been Called and Installed on June 6 (Pastor Karol part of Installation Commission). Jason Armstrong (Maumee) accepted as Inquirer in process of preparation for ministry. Approved moving Amy Remakius (Ottawa) to Candidacy. Rekindle Youth Retreat (7th-12th grades) will be November 12-14 at Kirkmont. Approved Maumee Valley Presbytery Leave Policy as amended.
- Deacons making plans for Community Meal hosted by Bluffton Presbyterian Church August 19. Gas and Meal Cards purchased for church member. Presbyterians Today Magazine subscriptions expire with the July/August issue. Working on promoting this and new subscriptions.
- Darlene Hey has volunteered to coordinate the Community Markets receipt program which Kay Ziessler had handled in past years. Stewardship Committee decided to continue offering the online giving option.
- Worship Committee continues to discuss possible equipment that better suits our sanctuary livestreaming needs. Gazebo sound system will also be discussed.
- Little Free Pantry - supplies are good currently. Lima Rescue Mission – servers are set for June and July, but needed for August. Summer Donation Drives – invite the congregation to purchase items or make monetary donations for Lima Rescue Mission (personal supplies), Disaster Clean-Up Buckets (sponsor a bucket or purchase identified cleaning supplies), School Supplies (monetary donation or list of items). Kick off for these drives will be Sunday, July 11 - Lima Rescue Mission and School Supplies end August 8 and Clean-Up Buckets on August 15. Congregation invited to assemble buckets following worship on Sunday, August 29.
- Approved Bluffton Presbyterian Church show appreciation to long term employees by recognizing their 10, 20, 30 -year anniversaries with following gifts – 10-year (\$20), 20-year (\$40), and 30-year (\$60) anniversaries. Approved following positions be salary: Pastor, Choir Director, Organist, Assistant Organist, and Treasurer and the following positions will be hourly: Administrative Assistant, Nursery, Faith Formation Intern, Custodian, and Communications Coordinator.
- Approved that effective July 1, when listing names of youth (newsletter, sign, etc.), only first name and first letter of last name will be printed.
- Approved revising our Covid-19 protocols “In accordance with recommendations by the CDC and the Ohio Department of Public Health, the church has lifted its mask requirements for those who are fully vaccinated. Those who are not fully vaccinated are asked to continue to wear masks until further notice.” Agreed by consensus to return to using bulletins, hymnals, and Bibles but refrain from indoor refreshments/food at this time.
