### **Pastor's Letter**

The Supreme Court's overturning of Roe v. Wade on June 24, 2022, will have a significant impact on church and society. I'm sure there are some in our church family who have rejoiced over this decision, truly believing it to be a movement towards justice and wholeness; and that there are also some in our church family who have wept, truly believing it to be a movement away from justice and wholeness. Furthermore, I can almost guarantee you that there are people in our church family for whom the issue of abortion is not merely a political or theoretical one, but an extremely personal one, an experience they and/or their loved ones have been through.

The members of our denomination are theologically diverse on this topic. A special committee report from 1992 finds:

"There are no biblical texts that speak expressly to the topic of abortion, but that taken in their totality the Holy Scriptures are filled with messages that advocate respect for the woman and child before and after birth. Therefore, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) encourages an atmosphere of open debate and mutual respect for a variety of opinions concerning the issues related to problem pregnancies and abortion."

"Part of the task of the church is to wrestle clearly and faithfully with the difficult issues that face human beings in the midst of a fallen creation. But this does not mean that answers are obvious, or that Scripture addresses clearly and directly all our contemporary concerns. The church is the body in which Christians can come together to seek guidance through the Holy Spirit. Such help may well come through the voices of other Christians who see things differently. When we have faithfully engaged in such discussion, even though we do not agree on all matters and significant differences remain, we may be able to speak with one voice on what we do see. We can also proclaim with great confidence that the God who created a good world continues, through Word and Spirit, to love and work with a fallen one."

It is not part of our constitution or something that prescribes beliefs; it is a document that describes the range of views on this complex issue across our denomination.

Further, the PC(USA) General Assembly (<u>https://ga-pcusa.org/</u>) that is currently in session (June 18 – July 9, 2022) is addressing similar issues as part of their extensive docket.

In our prayers and our conversations over the coming days and weeks, I invite us to bring our whole selves – whether content or confused, hopeful or fearful, resolved or uncertain – to the God who knows us intimately and desires wholeness and abundant life for us all. I also invite anyone who may desire to talk through thoughts, feelings, concerns, positions, etc. to find a time to meet with me.

# HIGHLIGHTS OF JUNE SESSION MEETING



## Highlights of June's Session Meeting

- Approved purchasing used Konica Minolta 360e (has 30,000 copies) from Approved Images. We would have a quarterly fee just like we do now for repair and maintenance based on number of copies.
- Pastor Karol shared that Sally Reeder's Memorial Service will be Saturday, September 17 at the church in the morning.

**Congregational Activities:** Deacons, Worship, and Faith Formation Intern Exit Interview (by email).

Community Engagement Activity: Bluffton Community Preschool Board Meeting. Presbytery/Greater Church Activity: MVP Findlay Area Region Church Meeting.

Approved Vacation request for Thursday, July 28 and 4<sup>th</sup> week of August to include one Sunday (either 21 or 28).

- Thermal Gard Windows has been out to measure manse windows. Have paid half as down payment. Presently planning for installation in January 2023 – anticipate 2 days. Volunteers have been working on the landscaping of the church lawn – spent a couple of days re-edging the gardens, spraying weeds, trimming bushes, and spreading mulch.
- National Night Out Tuesday, August 2 volunteers needed; donating \$100 from local mission budget line to support event.
- Having consulted with Anne McCracken, Session approved offering Min Lindsey's wooden animals/other items to congregation first, then consider selling any remaining items.

 Approved locking the outside door (by office) on Sundays at 10:15 during worship as safety measure to protect children in basement. Looking into new lock – perhaps one that can be programmed remotely. Volunteer will lock/unlock the outside door (by office) until a different lock is installed. Discussed Et Cetera Shop, Inc invitation to be a church sponsor – Dick McGarrity presently serves on the board. Responsibilities include – nominating 1-2 people to serve terms on board, publish annual report to congregation, and encouraging volunteers/ shoppers/contributions. Session approved becoming a church sponsor and asked that other churches be invited to participate as well.

- MMH worship scheduled for June 14 was cancelled due to village-wide power outage.

Powerful cultural and political structures conspire to relegate many children to substandard education – and then decry a high dropout rate that would perhaps be more accurately classified as a high "push out" rate. The urgency of this work is told in the cradle to prison pipeline, the rates of teenage suicide, in the lives doomed from their outset to despair and desperation and in the squandering of God's gracious gift of intelligence and imagination.
