Have you ever done a good thing, but it took on a life of its own, and became something else? Something contrary.

I am about to go on vacation. Sounds pretty straightforward. But I haven't taken one – a vacation without work – in years. I am grateful to God: I have been given music for my spirit, art to tell the story of God, ministry to share with others, and love in which to be called. Further, I am glad for the ministry of care given to Jane and me toward her parents. These gifts have been a calling, a joy, and a passion. But along the way, those good things took on a life of their own and I misplaced God's refreshment. God's Sabbath Rest. Time changed the balance of life. And it is time to get the balance back.

(Caring for my parents became caring for Jane's). We move on from yesterday's challenges to the questions of today and next year. Or we are supposed to, move, that is.

And sometimes we don't move on to what God has next.

So I am going to get my balance back. At least a start.



We had 8 youth and 3 adults participate this year in the 30 Hour Famine including members of the Ottawa Presbyterian Church. Through donations we raised \$595 that will be given to World Vision to help hungry children all around the world.

Our service project took place at the Bluffton Child Development Center. We worked on the playground spreading mulch and sand, painted shelving, and cleaned up the flower beds.

Our Bible studies focused on the good, the bad, and the ugly of hunger. We played games and spent the night in a cardboard village on the church lawn. Best of all we did all of this while going without food for 30 hours. It was a great event!!



Vacation Bible School

Deep Sea Discovery is the theme for this summer's Community Vacation Bible School. VBS will be held at Emmanuel UCC from Sunday, July 24 through Thursday, July 28. Children ages 4 through grade 5 are encouraged to participate in this free community program.

OUR MISSION: Family Promise is a faith-based agency working with various community partners, dedicated to helping homeless families achieve and sustain independence by providing help, hope and a safe haven as they seek suitable employment and housing.

Serving Homeless Families, A Community Effort

Family Promise serves homeless families in the Lima-Allen County area. We connect families with service agencies to help them find jobs to sustain them financially while they look for permanent housing.

The heart of the program is the churches that have focused their mission efforts locally. Participating churches provide temporary overnight accommodations for the families giving them a warm place to sleep, a nutritious meal in the

evening and the tender mentoring of volunteers to insure them someone cares about them. Annually, Family Promise serves 16 plus families which includes adults and children. We provide over 2500 shelter nights, over 8,000 meals with over 8400 volunteer hours. The positive housing outcome is 83.5% and about 75% find employment while at Family Promise


