Pastor's Letter: More Change?

The only constant in life is change, said the Greek philosopher Heraclitus. This seems true of most times, especially as we have adjusted and adapted for the past 15 months to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Some changes are good: more people are now protected from COVID-19, which means fewer people are getting seriously sick and dying from the virus than a year ago. Some changes are confusing: protocols are being added or eliminated sometimes overnight, and they do not all apply equally to everyone. Some changes are bad: our country is experiencing increased hate crimes against Asian Americans and Jewish Americans.

We cannot avoid change. We can, however, enact changes of our own – to enhance the good ones we've observed, to clarifying the confusing ones, and to resist the bad ones.

We also cannot predict the future. However, we can make choices that we believe will benefit our families, our communities, and our world. (Thy kingdom come...) We can do our part to prevent others from getting sick. We can spend time with those who are lonely or grieving. We can share our resources with the church to support its ministries, or with individuals or other organizations with whom we feel a strong sense of connection or compassion.

If we try to avoid change in life, we will never be successful for long. If we can learn to accept – even to embrace - change, we will be able to meet new challenges and circumstances with openness and courage, rather than with fear and anger.

As Christians, we do not just read the Bible as a book of ancient texts; we seek meaning from Scripture for our own lives. The gift of the Holy Spirit was not finished at Pentecost – the gift continues for each of us today. In John 3, Jesus says to Nicodemus, "The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." Our faith will change us – and with the Spirit's guidance, we will change the world – for good.

Highlights of May Session Meeting



- Approved following requested time off for Pastor Karol – Service to the Greater Church: November 3 - 6, 12 - 14 (including Sunday, November 14) for Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary Alum Board Meeting and MVP Rekindle Youth Retreat at Kirkmont Center; Continuing Education: November 15-18 for CREDO. Pastoral Care: 22 phone calls, 8 visits/ in-person conversations, and 12 greeting cards sent. Concerns of church family were shared. Congregational Activities: Worship, supervision and year-end review of Faith Formation intern, committee meetings, House of Hindenach meeting on sound system, Youth Group, Lord's Prayer discussion group, and Claralice Circle. **Community Engagement Activities:** Bluffton Community Preschool Board Meeting Zoom, interview with Findlay Courier reporter about new BPC Gazebo, and BAMA Meeting Zoom. **Presbytery/Greater Church Activities:** Moderate Ottawa Session Zoom, potential Inquirer (in ministry ordination process) Zoom, Discipleship Commission Zoom, Discipleship Commission Presbytery-Wide Zoom Gathering, New Pastors' Group Zoom, and MVP Leaders Space for Grace Zoom.
- Justin Byers (House of Hindenach) met with sound techs and others to discuss audio and other technical issues related to livestreaming. Soundboard was reconfigured/adjusted. Asked Justin to work up some proposals for new equipment purchase options that meet our needs. He's also been asked about options for a simple sound system setup for the gazebo. Ryan Brauen donated/installed software on the sanctuary computer so DVDs can be burned at the church. Owen and Ryan volunteered to burn DVDs for MMH and others when Dave Van Eman is away.
- Approved to receive Laura From's resignation as Deacon with regret (1½ yrs. left on term). With Laura's resignation as Deacon, Chris Hochstetler has agreed to serve as Moderator.

- Approved hiring Adam Shanaman as Faith Formation Intern for 2021-2022 academic school year.
- Little Free Pantry community use continues with donations maintaining supplies. Bluffton Food Pantry dropped off items because their demand has been lower and storage is getting tight. Frontline Worker Recognition some money remains in the BAMA account, but area frontline businesses have been visited. Special thanks to Sue Van Eman and Lynda Best for their help with deliveries. Clean Up Bucket Project congregation will be invited to sponsor a bucket or donate items toward the project. Lima Rescue Mission Drive planning on another collection drive for the Lima Rescue Mission.
- Approved request by "60's Survivors Band" to use Gazebo for a concert on Friday, July 30 and allow opportunity to play for tips. Approved request from Village of Bluffton to begin easement proposal process for electrical conduit/wire – electrical line/pullbox. New digital sign and Gazebo have filled current load amount and therefore they need additional to be used with Blaze of Lights Display.
- Approved Medical Leave Policy. In cases of severe illness (mental or physical), injury, or disability, non-clergy employees will receive up to 60 days for a medical leave of absence with full salary or average monthly rate for hourly employees. Clergy will be covered by Maumee Valley Presbytery's Leave Policy. If additional time would be needed, Personnel Committee should be consulted.
- Gazebo has been installed and being utilized! Article about Gazebo on front page of Findlay Courier. Wendell Badertscher will begin electrical installation this week includes 8 electrical outlets, off/on switch for overhead lights, installation of overhead fixtures, and running conduit from church to gazebo. Overhead lights to double as security lighting with motion detector option. Mark Burkholder will construct ramp (dirt, stones) to make area ready for concrete. Stratton Greenhouses will follow up with landscaping and reseeding, including area in front of sign.

Krystal Nichols (Nick and Jeanie's daughter-in-law) is in the hospital with pneumonia in an induced coma in Utah.


