Pastor's Letter

In mid-October I was fortunate enough to participate in a special retreat called CREDO that the PC(USA) Board of Pensions offers for ministers in their first five years of ordained ministry. CREDO is Latin for "I believe," or "I give my heart to." During this time away from our daily routines, we were encouraged to take an honest look at the balance of our lives. (We also experienced daily worship in which none of us as attendees were allowed to "lead" or "assist" in any way!)

Throughout this retreat, we were invited to cultivate wholeness-spiritual, vocational, health, and financial well-being—so that we may better serve the Church. We prioritized the values that we believe are most important to us. And then, we were challenged to create a "rule of life," a set of practices that may serve to guide us into a healthier way of life and discipleship and leadership. Many of the components of my rule of life are related to health, which when held up against my other core values, rose to the top of the list, much to my surprise. And yet it makes sense, of course: if I am not healthy and well, I will not be able to engage fully in all of the activities and practices that feed my other values of compassion, awareness of God, serving others, and more.

This process of reflection and discernment was not simple; it required a deep and vulnerably honest look at all the ways we fall short of the life I would like to live. The fact that I am a minister sometimes obscures the deeper truth that I am an ordinary human being, who needs to nurture my own personal relationships and spiritual connections at least as much as everyone else, if not more because of the complex nature of my role.

As we give thanks for all our blessings this month, why not take some time to pause from your hectic pace of life, reexamine your values, reflect on this community to which you belong (come to Presbyterian 101!), and experience anew the abundant life to which God invites us every day.

There are 3 paths into active church membership: profession of faith, reaffirmation of faith, and certificate of transfer. We have no age restrictions; no one is too old to become a member, and any youth who feels ready for this commitment should talk with their parents and/or myself. Educational opportunities can be made available to become more familiar with theology, governance, and more. But the primary profession of faith for membership is this: to proclaim Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. We are eager to welcome more people as active members of this family of faith, where we are Growing in Faith and Sharing God's Love.

Congregational Activities: Word in the World, Claralice Circle, Choir, Faith Formation Intern Interviews, Facebook Workshop, Church Wedding Reception, Community Picnic, BPC 170th Anniversary Reception, met with Faith Formation Intern, Weekday Christian Ed walker, Blessing of the Animals, and committee meetings. Presbytery activities: New Pastors' Group, Maumee Valley Presbytery Meeting, Boundary Training planning, and co-led Boundary Training Workshop for MVP. Community Engagement Activities: Devotional for Bluffton News, Chamber Breakfast, lunch with colleagues, and BAMA. Reminder of Continuing Education October 15-21 for CREDO Retreat -Texas (Board of Pensions) and Service to the Greater Church, November 1-8 MVP Youth Retreat, Chris' Installation Service, and Louisville Seminary Alum Board. Approved vacation request of October 22 (day after return from CREDO) and November 27 (day before Thanksgiving holiday). Will be offering "Presbyterian 101" on Sunday afternoons, November 10, 17, and 24 for anyone interested in a refresher/overview of the PC(USA) and what makes us PC(USA).
- both indoor/outdoor samples from manse both indoor/outdoor samples deemed not to have elevated levels of mold. Plan to use combination of fan/dehumidifier/air purifier, and occasional use of mold foggers to keep mold levels low. Mold fogger was used in late September in manse basement. New LED lights were installed on church sign on corner. A screw/hook was placed on the outside of exterior door in preschool room so door could be propped open while using handicap accessible entrance. Weather seal was replaced on exterior door in preschool room. Wires rehung in Office.

 at Findlay First. Elected teaching elders/ruling
 elders to fill positions for new presbytery
 restructuring design Leadership,
 Discipleship, Mission, and Central Support.
 Each team will have six positions. Pastor
 Karol will be serving on Discipleship.
- The Faith Formation interview team (Pastor Karol, Jane Sycks, Tenna Rhonemus. And Diane Winebar) concluded the interview process for Faith Formation Intern. Position was offered to Adam Shanaman and he accepted. Adam is a sophomore at Bluffton University, majoring in Bible Theology with a concentration in Youth Ministry. Adam is from Bellevue, Ohio and has experience working with youth of all ages. He has begun his official intake process with Pastor Karol and a meet and greet with the youth and their families was held Sunday, October 13 from 6-8 at the home of Ryan/Sarah Brauen.
- Community Picnic held on September 22 attended by over 100 people – ran out of food. We hosted Family Promise Meal for three families on October 8 at St. Mary's.

- Gift given to Pastor Karol from church family for Pastor Appreciation Month. Custodian Tony Carmack plans to retire at end of October (employee for 31 years). Agreed to announce position to church family (via Sunday announcements and email) for 10 days prior to advertising to public.

Attention Greeters: Revised Instructions

Thank you to everyone who serves as a greeter! Here are a few things to remember for your assigned day.

Before the Service:

- 1. Arrive at least 15 minutes prior to worship.
- 2. Station one greeter at entry to downstairs and one in front of sound tech.
- 3. If you see someone come in through handicap entrance, take them a bulletin.
- 4. Welcome people and hand out bulletins.
- 5. Make sure to talk to guests. Welcome them and ask their name.
- If you see a new family with young children, inform them of Time for Young Christians, available nursery, location of restrooms, and children's activity bags.
- 7. Remind guests who may have hearing difficulties about the hearing assistance units that are available from the sound technician.
- 8. If first Sunday of month, remind people to pick up their newsletter.

After the Service:

 Go back to your greeting stations and make sure you thank any guests for joining us, offer them a visitor packet (located on back cabinet behind sound tech), and welcome them to come back soon.

Roll On Campaign Introduced to Help Tyler and Laura From

(Highlights from the Minute for Mission)

Many of you know the Hursey family—Tom and Rebecca, their daughters Lisa and Laura, and Tom's mother Dorothy. Each member of the family has served our congregation in some way. In 2007, Laura became engaged to Tyler From. Tyler was attending UNOH in Lima when he was introduced to Laura through a mutual friend. They were married in our sanctuary in 2008 and shortly afterwards moved to Wyoming. Less than a year later, a freak accident left Tyler paralyzed.

For the last 10 years, Laura has cared full-time for Tyler. Her parents built an accessible room onto their home so Tyler and Laura could live with them. During the last year, it has become evident that the conversion van that they have been using was at the end of its useful life. Many in our church family worried each time the Froms left for medical appointments in Michigan or for a vacation. A few months ago, Tyler and Laura qualified for a loan to purchase a 2016 For Transit handicap van. For the first time, Tyler can look forward as they travel - but best of all, our church family no longer has to worry when they travel!

The *Roll On* Campaign invites each member to consider a one-time or repeating gift to help underwrite the monthly van payment. The church has committed to paying \$220 (1/2 of the payment) each month. Each gift will make it easier for Tyler and Laura to afford this necessary vehicle. The Campaign includes options of \$55 (1/4 payment), \$110 (1/2 payment), \$165 (3/4 payment), \$220 (full payment) or any amount that fits your budget.

Thank you for considering this campaign. As of October 1, four months of payments have already been pledged! In addition, the Mission Committee is planning a Blaze of Lights Benefit Dinner on November 30 with proceeds going to the Roll On Campaign.
