

A Congregational Meeting has been called for Sunday, November 13 following worship for the purposes of Dissolving Pastoral Call and electing Elders, Deacons, and Nominating Committee for 2023.

SESSION

October Meeting Highlights

- **Pastoral Care:** 10 visits/conversations and 13 phone calls.
Congregational Activities: weekly worship, Sally Reeder Memorial Service, Blessing of the Animals, and committee meetings.
Community Engagement Activities: Sunset Drive Neighborhood Picnic, Bluffton University Church Fair with Dick McGarrity and Cindy Gillen, and BAMA Meeting.
Presbytery Activities: MVP Meeting, Discipleship Commission Meeting/Study, and Retreat – Reframing Time: Attending to God’s First Gift.
Approved Continuing Education Request: Approved vacation request: October 30-31 (including Sunday, October 30) and November 23. Pastor Karol’s last Sunday will be December 4, proposing last day in office December 5. December’s salary will be prorated based on days of service. Approved request to have access to manse through the end of Dec. until a more specific move-out date is set.
- Matt Meinke, General Presbyter of Maumee Valley Presbytery, and Jim Cooper, presbytery liaison, were present to share information and answer questions now that Pastor Karol will be leaving. Session is responsible for securing temporary leadership. Matt suggested that a Transitional Task Force be formed, recommended 3 people to be trained by people from presbytery, for the purpose of securing temporary leadership. Approved that following serve as members of the Transitional Task Force – Carole Enneking, Dick McGarrity, and Marilyn Edwards.
- Maumee Valley Presbytery met September 20 at Norwalk Presbyterian Church. Elected Carole Burnworth Vice-Moderator of Presbytery for 2023. Examined candidate Amy Remaklus and approved for ordination. Per Capita for 2023 will be \$38.60 (General Assembly \$9.85, Synod of the Covenant \$3.25, and Maumee Valley Presbytery \$25.50). Welcomed Rev. Vanlal Hruaia at Van Wert and Rev. Dr. Jeff Schooley at Bowling Green.
- Linda Nelson has agreed to represent our church and serve a term on the Et Cetera Shop, Inc Board.
- Approved to participate in “Exploring the Pandemic Impact on Congregations” by [Hartford Institute for Religion Research](#) – church receives honorarium of \$2,500, with half paid in 2022 and half in 2026. Approved to not object to liquor license permit from Luke’s Bar and Grill. Approved Chris Hochstetler’s (Custodian) request to purchase a Shark Dyson sweeper which costs approximately \$150-200 (and then be reimbursed). Approved request from Bluffton Community Preschool to hold 2022 Christmas Program in the sanctuary on Monday, December 12 and Tuesday, December 13 between 5:00 to 8:00 p.m. with light refreshments afterwards in the preschool classrooms. Approved to receive Jeff and Kerry Fremont as members by Reaffirmation of Faith.
- Replaced burnt out bulbs in the church restrooms and corresponding light switches. Readjusted the preschool door so it shut properly. Retrimmed the front and side shrubs at the church. Cleaned up around the gazebo. Replaced furnace filters. Made adjustments to the thermostats. Unable to find feasible electronic door lock for back door (by office) so will need to have individual lock door every Sunday at 10:15 a.m. Further investigation into sweating of AC/furnace vent pipes in basement showed several small cracks in the wall behind drywall in closet (over piano) as well as one very large hole that led straight to the outside. Have since insulated those holes and patched the drywall – will have to wait until next summer to know if problem has been fixed. Since we spent \$400 for three snow removals last year, plan is for Dave or another committee member remove snow at the church this year.
- Approved hiring Laura Irwin as Children’s Church/Nursery, retroactive to September, at \$11 per hour.
- Approved to call Congregational meeting on Sunday, November 13 following worship for the purposes of Dissolving Pastoral Call and electing Elders, Deacons, and Nominating Committee for 2023.

November 2022 Deacon Highlights

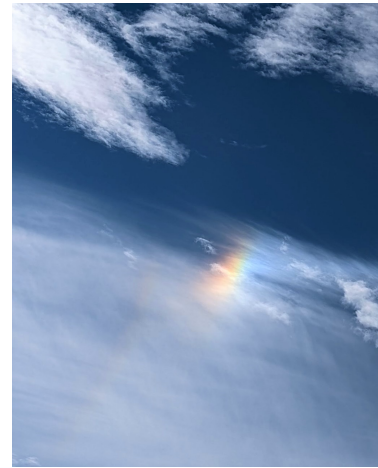
- Agreed to purchase Poinsettias again this Christmas for older members.

COVID-Related Funds Update

During September and October, BPC received money from the IRS for Employee Retention Credits. This credit is for employers who had lower receipts during parts of 2021 but did not reduce payroll.

During November, BPC expects to receive from Hartford International University for filling out a COVID impact survey. Session approved participation in the survey, under which we will continue to file annual surveys through 2026, at which time we will receive an additional.

Total funds provided to BPC from COVID-related programs are approximately, including approximately received in 2020-2021 under the Paycheck Protection Plan, received this year for Employee Retention Credits, and to be received in November from the Hartford Institute for Religion Research (and another in 2026). The funds have been used to cover gaps between current general fund offerings and expenses.
